

A Message from the Pastor

We Have A Heart



Happy Valentine’s Day!

Whether you *enjoy* or *avoid* Valentine’s Day, we all have one inescapable need: to feel loved. Love is a core value of

Cold Spring Church. God loves us more than we can possibly imagine.

“For God loved the world that he gave his one and only Son...” (John 3:16-17). We seek to, "love one another with mutual affection..." and to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10). We want to belong to something meaningful and feel cared for. Each of us can fulfill our life's mission of love that God has given us to do (Ephesians 2:8-10). God wants us to show that love to others every day of the year.

For many, special days like Valentine's Day only reinforces that we either feel loved, or it reminds us that we feel unloved. While all of us are unlovable from time to time, all of us can count on God "lavishing his love on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!" (1 John 3:1).

“The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart” (That is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if

you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Rom. 10:8b-13).

You are loved! All of us (and I mean all of us, including me!) struggle to consistently and authentically have a heart for everyone. Always listen and show respect to others. Jesus' love for the world shows us that we will have heart-to-heart contact with neighbors we might not agree with, with people we may not like, or even fear. Our neighbors, young and old, deserve to experience the love of God. And Cold Spring Church continues to deliver spiritual resources to our neighbors. As Presbyterians, we are positively influenced by the great 16th Century Reformers like John Calvin. Our faith affects our entire being. Our Transformation Journey engages both our mind and heart.

To "have a heart" as a follower of Jesus, however, is not easy. It is not automatic. On our *Transformation Journey*, we want to thoughtfully reflect on our ministry as we move forward. How do we do that? One way is to remind each other to test all we do by asking ourselves:

*"Does **my** idea show I have a heart?,"*

*"How does **our** project/ministry show the love of God?,"*

*"In what ways did **our** service/event/activity show God's love?,"*

*"How could **I** improve and better show God's love next time?"*

The Apostle Paul reminded the community of faith in Rome:

"The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim)."

As we embrace a ***We Have a Heart*** spirit this year, we will better reflect and demonstrate the love of God in greater Cape May because... (say it with me!):

I have a heart!

We have a heart!

Yes, we do, and we will!

5. Presbyterian Women: calendar of events for 2019.


The Session also discussed the following agenda items in progress:

"Outside the Walls"

Walls (and fences) are "in the news"! Of these reports, some are asserted to be "truth" while others are declared to be "fake"! Is there a truth about walls, fences, and gates? Why are there innumerable walls, fences, and gates in the world? (Just *wondering*: do such fortifications exist in Heaven or Hell?) Where is the truth? How can we discern "the truth" amidst the confusing narratives constantly proffered by the media? This is the outcome when man determines "the truth" expedient for the moment -- completely unhinged from absolute truth. As Christian believers, we know where absolute truth is to be found. It is not to be found in some political ideology, philosophical pronouncement, or the voice of a celebrity or media pundit; rather truth itself is found in a person --and that person is divine, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. "I am the way, **the truth**, and the life." (John 14:6) How can we, as followers of Christ, get His truth "out *there*" --beyond our walls? How can we present Jesus to those unchurched who live in our community?

Have you considered that who you are and what you do both *inside* and *outside* our "church walls" can be *attractive* and *contagious* to others? How can you, as an individual and ordinary person of the world transform yourself into an extraordinary *person of the Spirit*? How can a small group of such *Spirit-led persons* transform your church, the local "Body of Christ", into an attractive and contagious place to belong?

Our role model to emulate is Jesus Christ, who invited twelve individual and ordinary men to follow Him in his mission and ministry. In their continuing fellowship, this "band of brothers" learned how to do outreach ministry by observing how Jesus interacted with others: what He said, what He did, and how He connected with them. Jesus addressed their life problems and their life questions. He gave them hope in a new way of living: "I am the way, the truth, and the life"... "Follow Me"! These first apostles were transformed by imitating Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, and were sent out into their known world to inspire and encourage others to live likewise. Then as now, unchurched seekers become attracted to Christ's new way of living; then as now, Jesus' ministry becomes contagious! Are you now emulating Jesus Christ in your life? Are you now in fellowship with other Spirit-led persons? Have you shared with someone the transformative power of Christ in your life? Are you ready to be sent into the world *outside our church walls* as an emissary of Jesus Christ?

How do we treat our fellow men and women? As the world does or as Christ would have us do? The world of man celebrates power and control, wealth and status --a self-centered and "me first" attitude. In stark contrast, the world of God celebrates humility and service, integrity and righteousness --a self-sacrificial and altruistic attitude. They will know that we are Christians by our love! We demonstrate this love by giving of our time, energy, and attention to those within "our sphere of influence" --manifesting compassion, generosity, kindness, patience, and prayer for everyone we encounter. Through our example, we strive to inspire and encourage others to do the same. This inspiration is attractive and contagious!

Outside the walls of our church is our local "mission field"; let us "plant seeds" of Christ's Truth in the minds and hearts of those who are searching for answers to their life problems. People are hungry and searching for truth to their life questions: who am I? what is the meaning of life? what is my purpose? what is my destiny? The atheist-secular world is found empty --intellectually and morally bankrupt; it cannot provide the soul-satisfying answers to these deep-seated essential life questions. The opposition would have us stay in our sandbox --"walled in" as it were, so that the voice of Truth cannot be heard outside our walls. But we, the church --working together as the Body of Christ-- can breach these "politically incorrect" walls, influence and transform the lives of those who would otherwise be lost looking for the answers in all the wrong places.

This is how the early church overcame "the walls, fences, and gates" of the Roman Empire transforming their barbaric pagan culture into a Christian civilized world. We, in the twenty-first century, now face the same challenge of penetrating "the walls" of our atheist-secular culture; what an opportunity! Let us not remain

still and silent, to be found "conforming to the world" thus rendering God's Word to be weak and ineffective; rather let us assume the pro-active role of Jesus Christ "making a difference in the world"! Let this be our everlasting legacy: that *we made a difference* in people's lives --giving them a fixed hope in Christ's way, truth, and life! - *Rob Riehl*
