We hear every day about the homeless among us. The food banks are begging for supplies to fill their shelves. We have been blessed here at Cold Spring Presbyterian Church with many generous people who donate to our weekly food drive. Unfortunately many in our community head south for the winter, which makes a big difference in the donations to our food cupboard. Last month we collected significantly less than the 300 items we collected the previous month for our two food banks (St. Barnabas and the Church of the

Nazarene). I pray that we will continue to donate and increase our sharing each month. The list below is a guideline of the items the food banks have the most need of. In addition we take almost any non-perishable food and personal items.

The Session also discussed the following agenda items in progress:


- 1. Debrief of Annual Congregational Meeting on January 27, 2019;

"Pinball Connections"

Are you looking for something to do for Lent that is energizing and different? Play "Pinball Connections"!

There was a time when they seemed to be ubiquitous. Just about every town had a local "establishment" that housed one or more of these tabletop game machines commonly known as "pinball". An arcade filled with these game machines was "heaven on earth" to many of us youngsters who could, with enough coins, spend the day playing these fun-filled addictive games! One could delight in the propelling of marble-size steel balls into a slightly inclined field of play which was a maze of targets, bumpers, and flippers. ricocheted off targets and bumpers, lights would flash, "bing" sounds were heard, and points would be added to your illuminated score board; flippers were manipulated by the player to keep the steel balls "in play" thus racking up more points with the hope of winning the reward of a prize or free game. In due time, despite the best effort and skill of the player, all the steel balls would one-by-one roll down into a pit thus ending the game. But as most of us cannot eat just one potato chip, neither can a true gamer play just one round of pinball. So another coin is placed into the slot. The delight of being immersed in the lights, sounds, and playaction made for exciting and safe indoor entertainment!

So, you may ask, what is the connection between pinball and Lent? Well, there is no direct or logical link between the two; *however*, using the game of pinball as a <u>metaphor</u> for *what* you can do and *how* you can do it as an "outreach ministry" for the Lenten season does make a connection: allow the image of playing pinball mentally *challenge* and emotionally *energize* you to "play" your outreach ministry well! Your personal "outreach ministry game" starts with <u>you</u> as the player; the pinball game tabletop is your mission field (your community); the steel balls are the "what's" (the *thing* you want to send into the community); the targets are the people you want to reach; the bumpers can *bounce* the "what's" into another direction (and that could be good); the flippers are other persons who will help you *expand* the scope of your outreach (and that's *very good*). Keeping the image of the "pinball metaphor" in your mind will encourage you to play well --and to keep on playing-- throughout this season of Lent. Keep a 40-day journal (your "scoresheet") to track your performance. Journal entries will keep you focused and will serve as a wonderful memoir of what you have accomplished!

Now that you know "the game" and how to play it, what would you like to do in your mission field -- and who would be your "targets"? Here are a few ideas for you to consider: Give the gift of prayer. For forty days, pray for someone different each day --include the "difficult" ones too! Give the gift of service. For forty days, perform a specific and intentional act of service to someone different each day. If appropriate, do include your spouse! Give the gift of food items. For forty days, set aside a food item each day to donate to the local food bank (through our deacon ministry). Give the gift of visitation. For forty days, visit or call someone who is homebound, in a hospital, or rehabilitation center. Bring Christ into the conversation; pray together for healing, read an appropriate scripture reading. All of these are sacrificial acts by you --giving of your time, energy, and attention (TEA). The Lord will bless you --and those whom you have touched! Whatever you choose to do during the forty days of Lent, "bounce" your idea to a friend; invite him or her to consider joining with you in this mission endeavor. Perhaps you might form a team of three or more --"flipping" them into assisting you to "keep the ball in play". Think of the excitement that can energize and transform you, the "player" of this game. So, Pinball anyone?
