

Celebrating Wreaths Across America



Wreaths Across America has become a traditional ceremony here at Cold Spring Presbyterian Church Cemetery. Over the past thirteen years, our veterans cemetery has been an approved host site for this nation-wide tribute to our military personnel both

presently serving and those who have fallen. This annual event now takes place at over 1,700 locations across our country simultaneously at 12-noon in concert with the principal event (and original site) at Arlington National Cemetery. Locally, our ceremonial tribute event is sponsored and supported by the contributions and participation of several civic associations and veterans organizations, and by the many individuals who deem it important for us as a nation to continue to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice of their lives to protect our liberties and freedoms.

Standing upon such hallowed ground in the veterans' section of this historic cemetery moves

one to reflect upon the thoughts of our revered President Abraham Lincoln who noted that such military men gave their utmost devotion to duty, hoped that they not have died in vain, and that the government of, by, and for the people not perish from the earth. In more recent times, President Ronald Reagan called upon us to teach the younger generations the value of remembering and honoring those who have fought to preserve our freedoms and way of life -that we are never more than one generation away from losing the liberties that we now have.

Unexpected Expression Of Christmas Joy Appeared On Our Lawns!





How is your vision lately?



Is it time for a check-up? It's been a few years since I had my vision checked. The "wake-up call" sounded when I had reason to suspect that my vision had deteriorated a bit: it didn't seem to be at 20/20 anymore. I made an appointment in January to see the expert in this matter: my optometrist --he will examine my eyes, diagnose the problem, and proscribe the remediation for corrective lenses to restore the optimum 20/20 vision.

What are your expectations for 2020? What do you envision yourself doing to improve your life this year? Everyone wants a better "something" in 2020 than they had experienced in 2019. At this time of year, we are reminded of this cultural custom to seek the "new" and "improved"; we call this desire our "New Year's Resolution"! Our

human nature yearns to be part of something greater than one's self. It is why we join certain clubs, associations and organizations --to belong to a greater shared vision!

However, all these noble visions have inherent limitations: the groups are temporal and their visions changeable. But God calls us to become integrated in His grand vision for humankind. His infinite spiritual vision is absolute and unchanging because it is perfect and eternal, where the active participants can do greater things beyond their expectations!

How is your *spiritual* vision lately? Is it time for a spiritual check-up? What have you done lately to improve your spiritual vision? Have you considered what God's expectations are for you? His ways are always better -- and greater-- than anything we can conceive! May I suggest that you ask God to show you how to live in His expectancy. God does have a specific plan for each of us that somehow "fits" into His greater over-arching plan for the reconciliation of mankind. When all is said and done, this is THE PLAN that God has always had; there is no other plan! God's plan is unstoppable; His divine Will cannot be thwarted. In His often mysterious way, God will reconcile all things unto Himself. "Praise God from Whom all blessings flow!" Go with His flow and marvel at how God will use you in His church body in 2020! Whose plan do you think is better-yours or God's? Unbelievers have little choice; it's their own way or someone's suggested way. With us as believers, there is yet another way: God's higher way. We know from experience that manipulating our own way is inherently fraught with uncertainties and unintended consequences; we fear losing control of our planned vision. Allowing God to take control of our life vision and plan, we can overcome anxiety and fear by resting in His Word, relying on His promises, placing our hope and confidence in His eternal lovingkindness to us. He will guide us to the

vision that *really* matters: abiding in the spirit of God <u>now</u> and beholding His presence in eternity! Do you (or does anybody else?) have a grander and more glorious vision than this? Let go of self-sufficiency and let God be God in your life! Let God improve your vision through His corrective lenses that will allow you to see and understand *clearly* to embrace His divine plan.

As I transition from one church leadership role to another this year, I look to God to provide the details of His plan for me as they unfold in the fullness of His time. Adopting this *change of attitude* is life-changing! Following the Will of the Father, abiding in the Heart of His Son Jesus Christ, and following the imparted wisdom of the Holy Spirit in truth and in love-you too can be an active and integral participant in God's magnificent plan of reconciliation and restoration-bringing heaven to earth! Now there's an offer of a 20/20 vision for 2020 that ought not be refused!

With this being my concluding submission for the "Clerk's Corner" of our <u>Brickette Newsletter</u>, I acknowledge with gratitude your support and encouragement given over the years. It has been both an opportunity presented and a blessing to me to have been of spiritual service to you faithful readers and to this church congregation through this special ministry.
