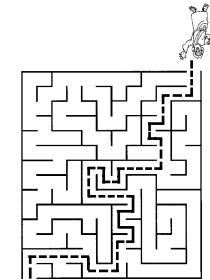
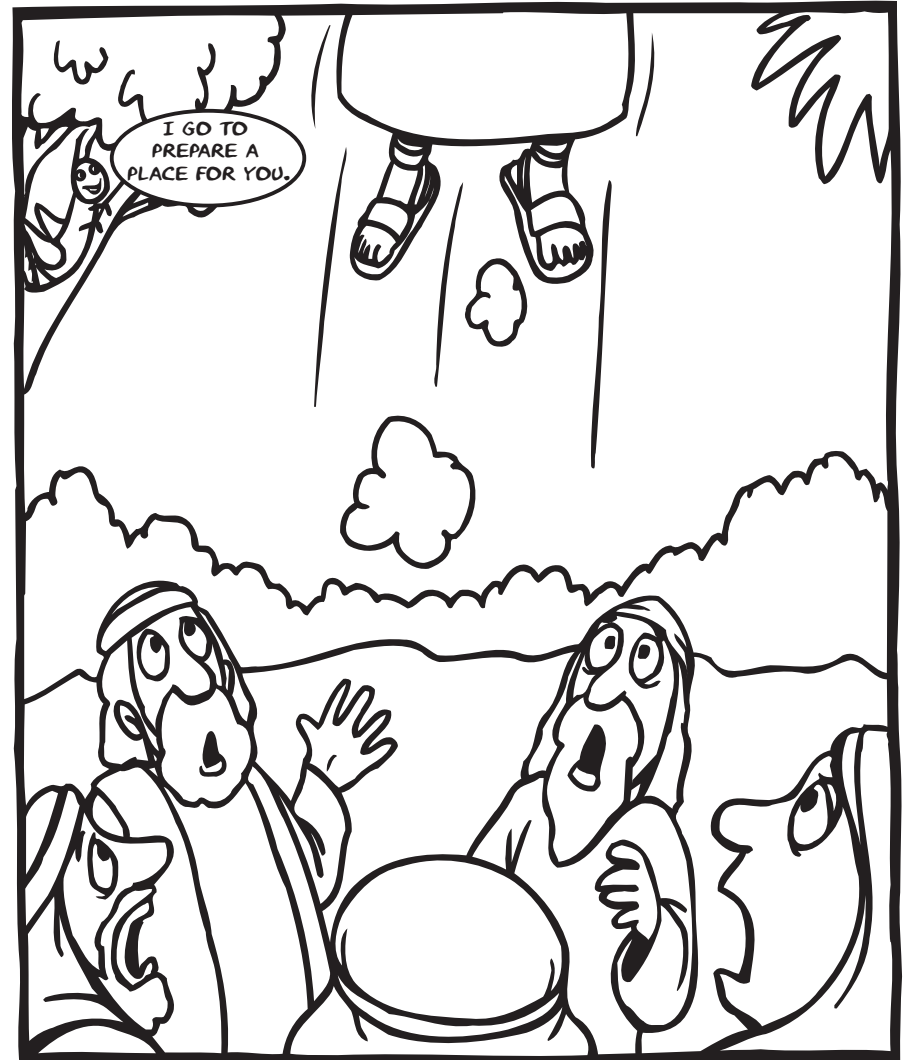
Questions
