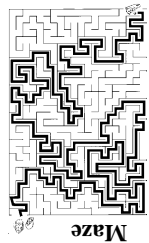

Did the girls think they were dreaming? Would you?

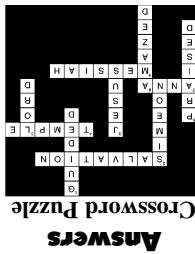
What do you think the shepherds were thinking long ago when they saw the angels in their fields?

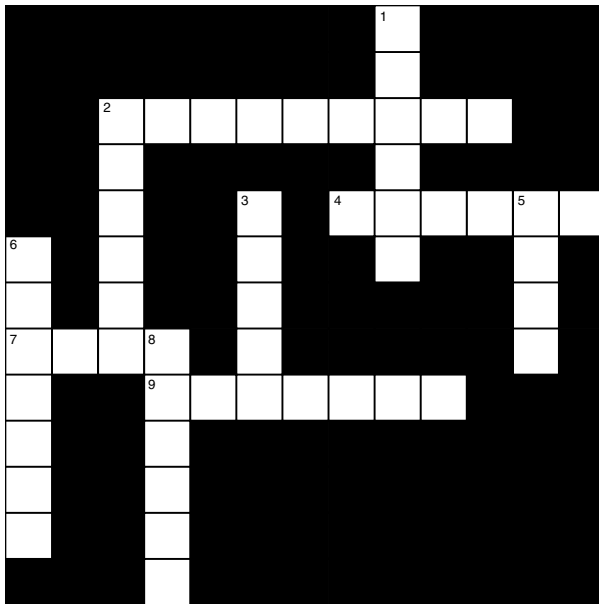
