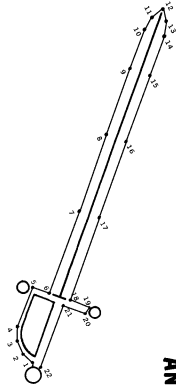

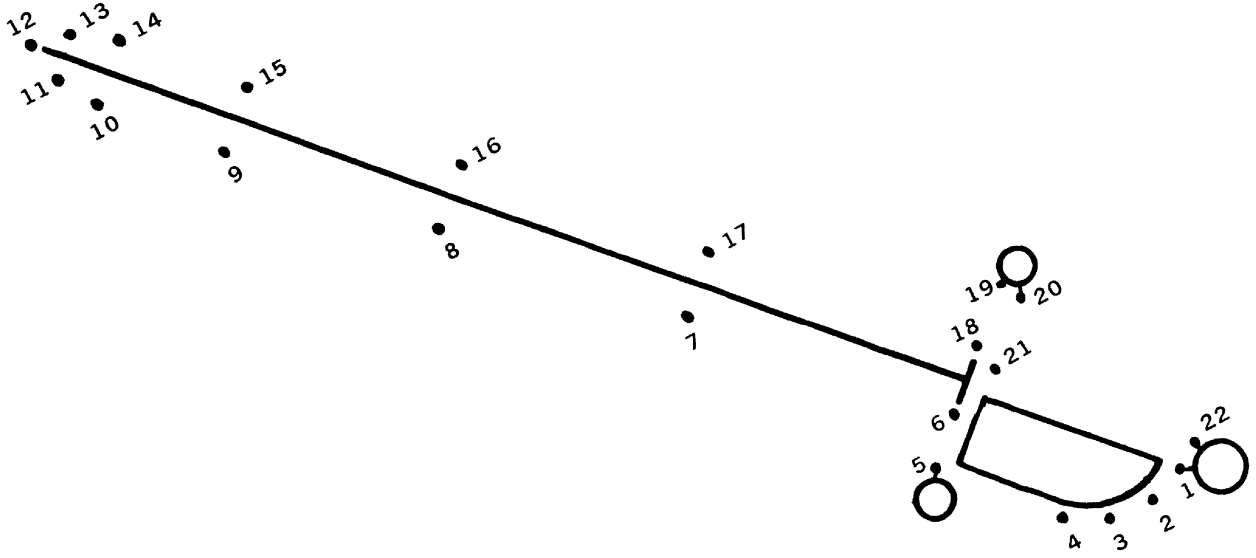

Matching Game. Here are some words from today's Gospel story in the left column. In the right column are some things that match the words. Draw a line between the things that match.

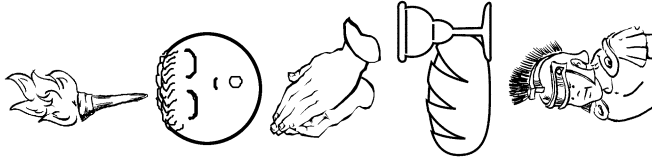
