

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.



INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBERS

An elder, representing the session, presents those who have been received by Reaffirmation of faith or Letter of Transfer:

Elder: The following friends have completed the Explorers Group new member classes and have been received by the session into the membership of this congregation. I present by Reaffirmation of Faith: Terryl Chapman, Amanda and James Dodd, Jayne and Dennis McDonough, Ann Griffith, and Linda Kaempf. I present by Certificate of Transfer Robin and Bob Stiles (from South Britain Congregational Church, Connecticut), and Katherine Dee Sloan (from The Presbyterian Church in Wildwood, now merged with First Presbyterian Church of the City of Cape May).

Minister: You come to us as members of the one holy catholic church, into which you were baptized, and by which you have been nurtured. We are one with each other, sisters and brothers in the family of God. We rejoice in the gifts you bring to us. As you join with us in the worship and mission of this congregation, let us reaffirm the covenant into which we were baptized, claiming again the promises of God which are ours in our baptism.

Hear these words from Holy Scripture:

"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all" (Eph. 4:4–6).

MEANING OF MEMBERSHIP

The minister addresses the candidates:

Sisters and brothers in Christ, our baptism is the sign and seal of our cleansing from sin, and of our being grafted into Christ. Through the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Christ, the power of sin was broken and God's kingdom entered our world. Through our baptism we were made citizens of God's kingdom, and freed from the bondage of

sin. Let us celebrate that freedom and redemption through the renewal of the promises made at our baptism. In that covenant God gives us new life; we are guarded from evil and nurtured by the love of God and God's people.

By becoming members of a faith community, we choose whom we will serve, by turning from evil and turning to Jesus Christ.

RESPONSES TO MEMBERSHIP QUESTIONS

The minister asks the following questions of the new members:

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

I do.

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love?

I do.

Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?

I will, with God's help.

Minister: With the whole church, let us all confess our faith (responsively)

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty,
the Maker of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell. The third day He arose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.

Minister: Dear friends, will you be a faithful member of this congregation, share in its worship and ministry through your prayers and gifts, your study and service, and so fulfill your calling to be a disciple of Jesus Christ?

I will, with God's help.

PRAYER OF RECEPTION (UNISON)

O God, we praise you for calling us to be like Jesus and gathering us into the body of Christ. We thank you for adding sisters and brothers in faith. May we live in your Spirit with the mind of Christ and so love one another and others, that greater Cape May will be transformed in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Minister: O Lord, by the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit, uphold Terryl, Amanda, James, Jayne, Dennis, Ann, Linda, Robin, Bob, and Katherine by your Holy Spirit. Daily increase in them your gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and joyfully worship the Lord, both now and forever.

The candidates answer: *Amen.*
