MESSAGE PREVIEW

We love to combine opposites, create unexpected pairings, or try surprising taste combinations. For example, who doesn't enjoy Reese's Peanut Butter Cups? What could be better than Chips and Salsa, Cookies and Cream, or Hummus and Pita? You may even like Chicken and Waffles and Biscuits and Gravy. But have you tried a Mountain Dew Flaming Hot soft drink made with Cheetos? How about Mac & Cheese Ice Cream? You may quickly agree that some opposites don't work together!

This week we will meet John the Baptist's disciples, Andrew and Simon Peter. They began their spiritual journey with their mentor, John, who focused on fasting, baptism, and God's judgment. But when Jesus appeared, they soon realized they couldn't just combine John's and Jesus' teachings. John's old ways were opposite to Jesus' new ways, kind of like oil and water. Moving forward requires us to respond to Jesus' invitation to *Come and See*, like Andrew and Peter. We are getting to what's next this week on our spiritual journey.

MUSIC PREVIEW

We begin with our new Winter countdown video. After our Call to Worship we sing *God Welcomes All*. During several musical reflections we ask God to help us receive the Spirit's presence. Following the message we will sing *Speak O Lord*, echoing Jesus' invitation to "Come and see." Our sending hymn continues the message theme. *O Lord You Called Disciples* was originally written by Rev. Carolyn Gillette for the 100th Anniversary Celebration of the First Presbyterian Church in Bay Minette, Alabama. Scripture references include John 1:35-51, 4:1-45; Matthew 4:18-22; Mark 1:16-20; Luke 5:1-11, 8:1-3; and Matthew 25:31-46. Churches grow when people are inviting to others. Maybe you will share with a neighbor, "We'd love for you to join us. Come and see what's happening at Cold Spring Church." "Come and see" is an even more effective invitation when spoken to people we know. Studies have shown that most people invited to worship by family or friends will come and see!

Message for Kids-Prayer for Families

GOSPEL READING: JOHN 1:35-42 (MSG)

The next day John was back at his post with two disciples, who were watching. He looked up, saw Jesus walking nearby, and said, "Here he is, God's Passover Lamb."

The two disciples heard him and went after Jesus. Jesus looked over his shoulder and said to them, "What are you after?" They said, "Rabbi" (which means "Teacher"), "where are you staying?" He replied, "Come and see for yourself."

They came, saw where he was living, and ended up staying with him for the day. It was late afternoon when this happened.

Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard John's witness and followed Jesus. The first thing he did after finding where Jesus lived was find his

own brother, Simon, telling him, "We've found the Messiah" (that is, "Christ"). He immediately led him to Jesus.

Jesus took one look up and said, "You're John's son, Simon? From now on your name is Cephas" (or Peter, which means "Rock").
