MUSIC PREVIEW

Following the message we will sing *In The Garden*, a gospel song written by American songwriter C. Austin Miles (1868–1946), a former pharmacist who served as editor and manager at Hall-Mack publishers for 37 years. According to Miles' great-granddaughter, the song was written "in a cold, dreary and leaky basement in Pitman, N. J. that didn't even have a window in it let alone a view of a garden."The song was first published in 1912 and popularized during the Billy Graham evangelistic campaigns of the early twentieth century

Our sending hymn is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus", a Christian hymn originally written by preacher Joseph M. Scriven as a poem in 1855 to comfort his mother who was living in Ireland while he was in Canada. Scriven originally published the poem anonymously, and only received full credit for it in the 1880s. The tune to the hymn was composed by Charles C. Crosstown in 1868.

God comes to us in grace; we respond in gratitude. Let us return to God a portion of what we have received.

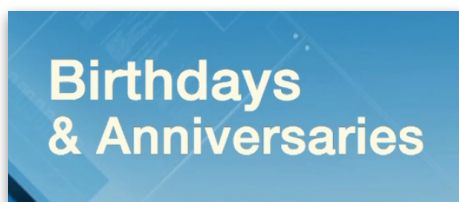
THE DOXOLOGY
