WORSHIP PREVIEW

Our message this Sunday will be delivered by Norris Clark titled "When We're All Like God," and look at what it means for us to be made "in the image of God."

MUSIC PREVIEW

Barbara Cain will be singing a Gaither hymn, "The Family of God". Bill and Gloria Gaither are faithful members of a local church in Alexandria, Indiana, and the church body is very dear to them. A young family in their congregation, Ron and Darlene Garner and their three children, inspired the writing of the Gaithers song "The Family of God".

Following the message we will sing "God Who Stretched the Spangled Heavens". Composer Cameron said "The hymn was written over a period of several months at a time when I was experiencing a new sense of direction, growth, and creativity in my life." Cameron wrote the text in 1967 during the space race between the Soviet Union and the United States.

Our closing hymn "Love Lifted Me" was written in 1912 Saugatuck, Connecticut. James Rowe wrote the lyrics and Howard Smith wrote the melody.

Rowe and Smith wrote the hymn based on the passage from the book of Matthew. Rowe plays upon the idea of sinking in water to sinking in sin and that Jesus can lift us out of despair to salvation.
