WORSHIP PREVIEW

Pastor David Wenker's message is "Who Is My Neighbor".

MUSIC PREVIEW

We will sing 3 hymns today, from the Blue hymnal, #464, #92 & #526. The opening hymn is Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee. While Henry Van Dyke was serving as a guest preacher at Williams College in Massachusetts in 1907, he was inspired to write a poem after seeing the Berkshire Mountains. He gave the completed writing to the college president and told him to sing it to the tune of "Ode to Joy." The poem highlights the connection between the creator God and His creation and notes how that connection brings us joy. The second verse of the song reminds people that "Heaven and earth reflect thy rays" and tells us of God's glory. The song ends by urging listeners to join in as the "Joyful music leads us sunward in the triumph song of life."

We will sing Communion Hymn Beneath the Cross of Jesus. The hymn was written as a poem and published with others by Clephane in a Scottish magazine. Ira Sankey, the evangelist, discovered it there and wrote the original tune, which is now usually replaced by the more familiar one by Frederick Maker.

The closing hymn, For All the Saints written by Bishop William How in 1864 for All Saints Day, a day meant to honor departed saints, whether known or unknown. This hymn, then, celebrates the saints who went before us—"who from their labors rest." It tells how God sustained them through difficult times—strengthened them to battle evil—brought them light in their darkest days. And it offers a prayer for the saints of today and paints a picture of the saints of all times streaming through the Pearly Gates in countless numbers, "Singing to the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, Alleluia, Alleluia!"

GOSPEL READING: LUKE 10:25-37

The Parable of the Good Samaritan

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. “Teacher,” he asked, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?”

“What is written in the Law?” he replied. “How do you read it?”

He answered, “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind’[a]; and, ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’[b]”

“You have answered correctly,” Jesus replied. “Do this and you will live.”

But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

In reply Jesus said: “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.

He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii[c] and gave them to the innkeeper. ‘Look after him,’ he said, ‘and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.’

“Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?”

The expert in the law replied, “The one who had mercy on him.”

Jesus told him, “Go and do likewise.”
