WORSHIP PREVIEW

Pastor David Wenker's message is "Gratitude: The Outward sign of Inward Trust."

Where do you call home? Some are heading home this Thanksgiving. According to *The Vacationer*, which just released its annual 2023 Thanksgiving Travel Survey, over 45.21 % of American adults (ages 18 and up) plan to travel for Thanksgiving this year, a slight increase from the 43.37% reported in last year's survey. That's more than 117 million travelers, based on the most recent U.S. Census data. "Unfortunately, Americans are seeing rising gas prices and expensive flights and understand they will have to pay more this year to travel for Thanksgiving," according to *The Vacationer*.

Wherever you've been, and no matter where you may be going this Thanksgiving, experience gratitude and spiritual abundance at Cold Spring Church, where everyone can discover a safe place to experience God's love. Welcome home, where you belong.

MUSIC PREVIEW

The opening hymn is *Let All Things Now Living*, a song of thanksgiving. Written by Katherine K Davis in 1939, Ms. Davis was an American woman who served as a teacher, classical music composer, and pianist. She also wrote The Little Drummer Boy. Born in Missouri she wrote her first composition at age 15. She died in 1980 at age 82. She willed all royalties from her music to Wellesley College where she was trained and taught. This has been a good support to the music program there. The music video after the message is a beautiful song, "Give Thanks" sung by gospel singer, Cece Winans. This worship song was written in 1978 by Henry Smith. The young seminary graduate penned it during a difficult time in his life when he was struggling to find work and coming to terms with a degenerative eye condition that would eventually leave him legally blind. Smith's inspiration was the scripture, "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." Finding hope in 2 Corinthians 8 v 9's description of God becoming human to save man, he penned this simple song of trust and giving thanks.

The closing hymn is *My Tribute*, composed in 1971, one of the signature songs by Andraé Crouch. The final chapter of Crouch's autobiography, entitled 'To God be the glory', is from the song's refrain, which is an allusion to the hymn 'To God be the glory, great things He hath done'* by Fanny Crosby*. In the language of his African American Pentecostal heritage in the Church of God in Christ

(COGIC) tradition, the composer offers his own Soli Deo Gloria. The concluding chapter of the composer's autobiography functions as a personal reflection on this theme: "I worship Him with my life, in what I do and witness. I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do. And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was. I excitedly said, 'It's all about GLORY!"

GOSPEL READING: MATTHEW 20:1-16

The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard

"For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard.

"About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. He told them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went.

"He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, 'Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?'

"Because no one has hired us,' they answered."He said to them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard."When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.'

"The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 'These who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.'

"But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?"

"So the last will be first, and the first will be last."
