WORSHIP PREVIEW

The message for today is titled, "Are We Pilgrims?" presented by Norris Clark.

On Christ the King Sunday, we will consider, How did Christ the King end up on the cross? And what about the other two also condemned to die? From Skull Hill to a welcoming eternal home, God has placed us in the physical and spiritual locations where we are. Throughout the story of Scripture, place is a very important concept. MUSIC PREVIEW

The opening hymn, "How Great Thou Art" is a Christian hymn based on an original Swedish hymn entitled "O Store Gud" written in 1885 by Carl Boberg (1859–1940). The English version of the hymn and its title are a loose translation by the English missionary Stuart K. Hine from 1949. The hymn was popularized by George Beverly Shea and Cliff Barrows during Billy Graham's crusades. "How Great Thou Art" was ranked second (after "Amazing Grace") on a list of the favourite hymns of all time in a survey by Christianity Today magazine in 2001 and in a nationwide poll by Songs Of Praise in 2019.

The closing hymn, "This World Is Not My Home" is a hymn that was written by AP Carter in 1931. It was arranged into music by Albert Edward Brumley in 1937. This song expresses the belief that has been held by saints throughout history who see this world as not their home. Their home is in heaven. Jesus promised those who believe in him that he has gone to heaven to prepare

mansions for them. And that he will come back to take saints to live with him in heaven. Here on earth, we may go through all sorts of afflictions and persecutions, but it is the belief that one day the arch angel will sound the trumpet and the saved of earth will be caught up to meet the Lord in the sky and be with him forever, that soothes us.

Albert E Brumley was born on 15th November 1905 in Springfield, Missouri. He studied music at Hartford Musical Institute in Arkansas. He is reported to have written over eight hundred hymns.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 11:8-16

By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she[a] considered him faithful who had made the promise. And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.

All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth. People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.
