#### **MUSIC PREVIEW**

The opening hymn is "O Come All Ye Faithful." From its Roman Catholic origins, this 18th-century hymn has spread worldwide by many denominations in both Latin and local language versions. Once popular with a wide range of hymn texts, this tune is now firmly associated with this Christmas text from which it is named.

The Hymn to prepare for communion is "What a Friend we have in Jesus", a Christian hymn originally written by preacher Joseph M. Scriven as a poem in 1855 to comfort his mother, who was living in Ireland while he was in Canada. Scriven originally published the poem anonymously, and only received full credit for it in the 1880s. The Closing hymn is "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day". On Friday, December 25, 1863, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow—as a 57-year-old widowed father of six children, the oldest of which had been nearly paralyzed as his country fought a war against itself—wrote a poem seeking to capture the dissonance in his own heart and the world he observed around him that Christmas Day.
