WORSHIP PREVIEW

Pastor, Rev. David Wenker's. Message is Walking with Jesus: Enough.

A sense of not having enough or a sense of not being enough is common for us humans. Our imagination can come up with all sorts of scenarios where what we have and what we are will not be enough. Falling into that trap is what I call "Spiritual Orphan Thinking". It is as though we were alone in the universe, spiritual orphans, with no one to support us. Rather, learning to live as beloved daughters and sons of our Heavenly Father means we will have enough and be enough for what our Father asks of us. Sometimes Father asks us to trust we are enough and have enough. Sometimes Father asks us to take responsibility and do something different. Sorting it out is challenging.

MUSIC PREVIEW

We are very excited to welcome George and Ruthann Waldie, who will be providing our special music and Offertory music. George and Ruthann recently moved to Wildwood from West Chester where she was a high school music teacher and choral director. George and his daughter still lead a 200 voice community choir in West Chester. Since moving here Ruthann has served as director for the Angelus Community Singers, a 65 voice chorus in Cape May County. George sang at the Cold Spring Presbyterian Church years ago with his family.

George and Ruthann will be singing, *All Good Gifts* by Joseph M. Martin and The Gift of Love, a traditional English Melody, by Hal H. Hopson.

Our opening hymn, "To God Be the Glory", celebrates the greatness of God and calls upon an appreciation for the wondrous things "He hath done." It is a glorious hymn to be sung rejoicefully in the spirit of gratitude.

The closing hymn, Great is Thy Faithfulness, is a Christian hymn that originated in the United States. The lyrics were written by Thomas O. Chisholm, a Methodist minister from Kentucky. He wrote the poem in 1923 about God's faithfulness over his lifetime.

JESUS FEEDS THE FIVE THOUSAND

When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida, but the crowds learned about it and followed him. He welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

Late in the afternoon the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."

He replied, "You give them something to eat." They answered, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd." (About five thousand men were there.)

But he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each." The disciples did so, and everyone sat down. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to distribute to the people. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.
