WORSHIP PREVIEW

Elder Norris Clark concludes his message series "To Tell the Truth" with the message "To Tell the Truth About Others".

MUSIC PREVIEW

The opening hymn, Brethren We Have Met to Worship, is one of the oldest published American folk hymns. It comes out of the early 19th Century southern camp meeting experience where believers were invited to pray for new converts. The lyrics were written by George Atkins and first published in 1819. The traditional tune, Holy Manna, is a pentatonic melody in Ionian mode originally published by William Moore in Columbian Harmony, a four-note shape-note tunebook, in 1829. Like most shape-note songs from that century, it is usually written in three parts.

After the message we will sing Near to the Heart of God. This hymn was born out of tragic

circumstances. Cleland McAfee (1866-1944) suffered the loss of two infant nieces to diphtheria in 1903. McAfee was preacher and choir director of the campus Presbyterian church at Park College, Parkville, Mo. His daughter described the account in her book, Near to the Heart of God.

Our closing hymn is Love Lifted Me, a popular hymn written by James Rowe in 1912. The lyrics draw from the stories of Jesus and his disciples at sea from the book of Matthew. Rowe plays upon the idea of sinking in water to sinking in sin and that Jesus can lift us out of despair to salvation.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (UNISON)

Living Christ, with whom we journey to the cross, we confess that we are always looking for an easier way. We long for the fullness of life with you, but we are slow to abandon the comforts of the life we know. We seek the fruit of new life, but we are not willing to die to ourselves. God of living water, pour out your Spirit and nourish your Word within us, that in its time, that Word may bear much fruit. Amen.
