

WORSHIP PREVIEW

Pastor Dave Wenker's message is Titled "Run With Horses".

Life is hard. The challenges will test our character and faith almost every day. The question for today is how we respond when it gets hard. Will we wallow in self-pity, blame others, get angry at everyone, disconnect from life? Or will we grow to meet the challenge? A Guideposts article called 'Miracle' gets to the point. "Do not pray for easy lives; pray to be stronger...Do not pray for tasks equal to your powers; pray for powers equal to your tasks. Then the doing of your work shall be no miracle, but you shall be a miracle. Every day you shall wonder at yourself, at the richness of life which has come to you by the grace of God." MUSIC PREVIEW

The gathering hymn is "I Sing the Mighty Power of God", written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), an English Congregational minister, theologian, logician, and prolific hymn writer. The hymn was originally published as "Praise for Creation and Providence" and was intended to be sung by children. Watts believed that children would understand God's creation, providence, and love by singing the words repeatedly.

The hymn of meditation is "Today We All Are Called To Be Disciples".

This text placing stewardship in the context of faithful witness was written by a retired Presbyterian minister to be part of the 1986 stewardship campaign titled "Called to Be Disciples." The tune name recalls the Sussex village where the arranger first heard the melody.

The closing hymn is "God of Grace and God of Glory". Harry Emerson Fosdick, a prominent liberal preacher and Baptist minister, wrote "God of Grace and God of Glory" in 1930 for the dedication of Riverside Church in New York City. The hymn was first performed at the opening service on October 5, 1930 and again at the dedication on February 8, 1931. Fosdick wrote the hymn during the Great Depression, and it is a call to conscience that condemns social sins like war and greed.

Jeremiah's Complaint

You are always righteous, Lord, when I bring a case before you. Yet I would speak with you about your justice: Why does the way of the wicked prosper? Why do all the faithless live at ease? You have planted them, and they have taken root; they grow and bear fruit. You are always on their lipsbut far from their hearts. Yet you know me, Lord; you see me and test my thoughts about you. Drag them off like sheep to be butchered! Set them apart for the day of slaughter! How long will the land lie parched and the grass in every field be withered? Because those who live in it are wicked,

the animals and birds have perished.

Moreover, the people are saying, "He will not see what happens to us."

God's Answer

"If you have raced with men on foot and they have worn you out, how can you compete with horses? If you stumble in safe country,how will you manage in the thickets by the Jordan? Your relatives, members of your own family— even they have betrayed you; they have raised a loud cry against you. Do not trust them, though they speak well of you. "I will forsake my house, abandon my inheritance; I will give the one I love into the hands of her enemies.

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.
