Message Preview:

Rev. David Wenker's message is "A Long Obedience in the Same Direction"

My title comes with thanks to the late Rev. Eugene Petersen, who authored one of my favorite books with that title. Today we will be considering the Fruit of the Spirit; Faithfulness.

Faithfulness is the endurance to follow Jesus no matter what throughout our lives; a long obedience if you will. Faithfulness is not a duty we keep but a relationship we cherish and nurture. God's love for us is not only faithful in all circumstances of our lives but it is fresh and new each day. Faithfulness is not perfection in obedience. It is the daily repentance to return each

time we may stray.

The Prelude, hymn "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" was written by Scottish pastor Walter Chalmers Smith in the late 19th century, inspired by the Apostle Paul's words in 1 Timothy 1:17. Smith spent nearly four decades refining the hymn to capture the profound mystery of God's nature as an incomprehensible, yet powerful and unchanging being, using the central metaphor of light to portray His majesty and inaccessibility.

The story behind the Offertory song "Simple Gifts" is that it was composed in 1848 by Elder Joseph Brackett of the Shaker community as a dance song celebrating their ideals of simplicity and humility. The song remained largely unknown until American composer Aaron Copland incorporated its melody into his 1944 ballet Appalachian Spring, which brought the tune to a wide audience. Later, British composer Sydney Carter wrote new lyrics to the melody, creating the popular hymn "The Lord of the Dance," which was also famously used in Michael Flatley's dance show of the same name.

The Gathering hymn, "All Things Bright and Beautiful" was written by Cecil Frances Alexander in 1848 to help children understand the Apostles' Creed, specifically the first line, "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth". The hymn's text was inspired by the natural beauty Alexander witnessed during her visits to various locations, including Llanwenarth House in Wales and Bellarena House in Northern Ireland. The melody most often associated with it was composed by William Henry Monk.

The hymn of Meditation, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" was written by Thomas O. Chisholm in 1923, inspired by Lamentations 3:22-23, as a testament to God's steadfast love amidst Chisholm's lifelong struggles with ill health and financial difficulties. Chisholm, an ordinary man with a passion for poetry and the Bible, sent the poem to his friend and musician William Runyan, who set it to music. The hymn gained widespread popularity after being featured in Dr. William Henry Houghton's ministry at the Moody Bible Institute and later by Billy Graham in his international crusades.

The Sending hymn, "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" was written by Welsh preacher William Williams of Pantycelyn in the 18th century, originally in Welsh, to express a Christian's longing for God's guidance through life's hardships, drawing heavily on biblical imagery of the Israelites' journey through the wilderness. The hymn uses metaphors of a "barren land," "bread of heaven," and a "pillar of cloud and fire" from the book of Exodus to depict a perilous spiritual journey, reflecting Williams' own difficult travels as an itinerant preacher.

If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.
