

#### MUSIC PREVIEW:

The Gathering hymn "Angels from the Realms of Glory" was written by English poet James Montgomeryin 1816 to celebrate the birth of Jesus. It draws on the biblical account of the angels who announced Jesus's birth to the shepherds, calling on

various groups—including angels, shepherds, wise men, and sinners—to join in worshipping the newborn King. The carol was originally a poem published on Christmas Eve in Montgomery's newspaper and later became a hymn, often set to the tune "Regent Square," composed by Henry Smart.

"Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence", the phrase comes from a Christian hymn with origins in the 4th-century Liturgy of St. James, a pre-Eucharistic prayer that calls for awe and reverence before the arrival of Christ. The text was later translated into English in the 19th century, and the hymn is now widely used during Advent to reflect on Christ's descent to earth and sacrificial death. It is considered one of the oldest hymns still in use today.

The hymn "Blessed Be the God of Israel" is a metrical paraphrase of the "Benedictus," also known as the Song of Zechariah from the biblical text of Luke 1:68-79. The story behind it is that after his son, John the Baptist, was born, Zechariah's tongue was loosed, and he burst into a prophecy and song of praise. The hymn captures Zechariah's words of thanks and his recognition that John would prepare the way for the coming Messiah, Jesus.

#### FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: ISAIAH 2: 1-5

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

#### SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: ROMANS 13: 11-14

And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

#### GOSPEL READING: MATTHEW 24: 36-44

"But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son,[a] but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left. "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.
