

MESSAGE PREVIEW:

Rev. Virginia Scott message is titled: "Let It Begin With Me"

Please welcome Rev. Virginia (Ginnie) Scott to our service this morning. Rev.

Ginnie received her Master's in Divinity & Master's in Theology from the Princeton Seminary and was actually there about the same time as Rev. Dave Wenker! She retired last December, after 45 years in ministry.

Rev. Ginnie grew up going to the beach with her Grandmother in Ocean City and after retirement has settled in South Seaville. She very recently came to Cold Spring looking for a church and we are so glad she found us and so grateful for her ministry this morning!

MUSIC PREVIEW:

Our Gathering hymn, "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus" is a 1744 Advent and Christmas carol common in Protestant

hymnals. The text was written by Charles Wesley. It is performed to the tune, "Hyfrydol" by Rowland Prichard, in our hymnal. The hymn is considered an enduring classic in Christian hymnody.

"What Child Is This?" is a Christmas carol with lyrics written by William Chatterton Dix in 1865 and set to the tune of "Greensleeves", a traditional English folk song (possibly by Richard Jones), in 1871. Although written in Great Britain, the carol today is more popular in the United States than its country of origin. The lyrics were inspired by one of William's verses titled "The Manger Throne." It urges humanity to accept Christ. The eloquent melody is haunting, and its beautiful essence reiterates the "Adoration of the Shepherds" who paid a visit to Jesus during the nativity.

Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote the hymn, "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day", on Christmas Day 1864 after suffering two devastating blows – his wife's tragic death in a fire and his son's severe wounding in the Civil War. The song tells of the narrator hearing Christmas bells during the American Civil War, but despairing that "hate is strong and mocks the song of peace on earth, good will to men". After much anguish and despondency the carol concludes with the bells ringing out with resolution that "God is not dead, nor doth He sleep" and that there will ultimately be "peace on earth, good will to men".
