MESSAGE PREVIEW:

We welcome Rev. Virginia Scott to the pulpit today. Her message is titled "It's the Will of God".

MUSIC PREVIEW:

"Morning Has Broken" began as a poem by Eleanor Farjeon in 1931, set to an old Scottish Gaelic tune called "Bunessan," celebrating creation and new beginnings, but became a global hit after Cat Stevens (now Yusuf Islam) recorded his piano version in 1971, transforming it from a children's hymn into an anthem of hope and peace. Farjeon, a noted children's author, wrote the verses for a church songbook, drawing inspiration from the beauty of the natural world and Genesis, while Stevens discovered it during a dry spell, finding its universal message of renewal compelling.

"Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart" was written by George Croly, an Irish Anglican minister and writer, in the mid-1800s while he was serving a poor London congregation; it's a heartfelt prayer for the Holy Spirit's indwelling presence, seeking inner transformation, purification, and the strength to love God wholeheartedly, reflecting his experiences with deep faith and spiritual struggle amidst poverty and doubt.

"God of Grace and God of Glory" was written by prominent liberal preacher Harry Emerson Fosdick in 1930 for the dedication of New York City's Riverside Church, a challenging time during the Great Depression, making it a powerful prayer for courage, wisdom, and social justice for a church facing modern evils and societal struggles. It's a Social Gospel hymn, asking God to help the church overcome war, greed, and apathy, and to be a force for healing and freedom.

OPENING PRAYER: (UNISON)

Come, Holy Spirit, our guiding Light and Strength, for we gather on this day, the Baptism of our Lord, to hear your Word and be renewed in your presence. You call us, O God, from the waters of our own lives, affirming your beloved Son and commissioning us to be your servants in the world. We thank you for this sacred moment, for the promise of new beginnings and the enduring hope found in Christ. As you anointed Jesus, anoint us with your Spirit, that we may walk in your path of peace, bring light to darkness, and live out your justice and love in our homes, our community, and our world. Equip us, Lord, for the work you set before us, that we may be your hands and feet, reflecting your glory and sharing your boundless mercy. Hear our prayer, O God, as we offer it in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior. Amen.

CALL TO CONFESSION:

On this Baptism of the Lord Sunday, we remember our own baptisms, where we were claimed as children of the covenant and beloved of God. Yet we live as those who are alienated from God. We have turned away from God, one another and the earth. Let us confess our sins, trusting in God's mercy.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (UNISON)

Merciful God, we confess that we are estranged from you and from one another. We treat others as strangers rather than as people created in your image and fellow children of God. We exploit the earth as though it were our possession rather than a gift entrusted to our care and a reflection of your image and glory. Forgive us our sins and transform us by your Spirit that we might live as people who have been baptized as your own children. Amen.

Silent Reflection

HEAR THE WORDS OF ASSURANCE: (RESPONSIVE)

One: Friends, hear the good news of the gospel — and of Jesus' solidarity in his own baptism by John with all who have been immersed in baptismal waters, repenting of their sin.

Many: In his name, God has forgiven us of our own sins and set us on new paths.

One: Let us remember our baptisms and trust in God's mercy to restore our right standing as God's own.

Many: Thanks be to God!

In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."
