MESSAGE PREVIEW:

Rev. Wenker's message is titled, "So What's in a Name?"

I was taught that "Sticks and stones may break my bones but names will never hurt me." The bruises from sticks and stones healed much faster than the names. Why does it hurt to be called a bad name? It hurts because a name identifies us. It can dehumanize us, but it can also inspire us. It matters how we use God's name. God has given us the name of Jesus to call upon in times of trouble. He has told us we can ask anything in his name. We will examine how we can make God's name holy.

MUSIC PREVIEW:

Ruth Rich will be playing her flute with our hymns and playing two beautiful spirituals for the offering.

The story behind "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" involves its author, Edward Perronet, a dissenting preacher who opposed the Church of England and the King, writing it to elevate Jesus as the ultimate King; it's famously known for a missionary tale where Rev. E.P. Scott in India,

surrounded by hostile warriors, played and sang the hymn, causing them to lower their spears in awe, leading him to minister to them. The hymn, written around 1779, became known as the "National Hymn of Christendom" for its universal message of Christ's sovereignty, despite its author's anti-establishment sentiments.

"There's Something About That Name," written by Bill and Gloria Gaither, emerged from their personal experiences with life's major transitions: the death of their grandparents, who called on Jesus in their final days, and the birth of their own children, which brought new anxieties and reliance on His name. The song reflects the comfort, peace, and transformative power found in Jesus' name, whether facing the end of life or the beginning of parenthood, seeing it as a source of strength and renewal.

The hymn "His Name is Wonderful" was written by Audrey Mieir in 1959, inspired by her brother-in-law's exclamation, "His name is wonderful!" after a church Christmas program, echoing Isaiah 9:6's prophecy of the Messiah. Mieir felt moved to write the chorus and later added verses describing Jesus as the Great Shepherd, Rock of Ages, and Almighty God, creating a worship song that became popular year-round, not just at Christmas.

For the Offertory, Ruth will be playing Steal Away. This spiritual illustrates the double meanings at work in many African American slave songs: it is both a call for a direct encounter with Jesus and a summons to slip away from servitude to freedom. Nat Turner reportedly used this song to call together his followers in 1831. And Precious Lord, Take My Hand, this black gospel song, like much hymnody, sprang out of the author's deep personal loss (the death of his wife and newborn son), yet it has brought solace to many. He thought his fingers were playing new music but they unlocked a deep memory of a tune almost a century old.

"Take the Name of Jesus With You" was written by Lydia Baxter around 1870 while she was bedridden from chronic illness, drawing from her personal experience of finding immense strength, joy, and a "shield" from despair in the name of Jesus, a practice she shared with visitors from her sickbed, leading to this powerful testimony that became popular in revivals.
