MESSAGE PREVIEW:

Norris Clark, Ruling Elder,

Pulpit Supply will give the message titled, "It's a Wonderful Life".

MUSIC PREVIEW:

"*How Great Thou Art*" began as a Swedish poem, "O Store Gud," by pastor Carl Boberg in 1885, inspired by a sudden thunderstorm followed by calm beauty, leading him to reflect on God's majesty. The poem was set to a folk tune, translated into German and Russian, and later adapted into English by missionary Stuart K. Hine, who added verses, with the final version popularized globally by George Beverly Shea at Billy Graham crusades in the 1950s.

"*I Sing the Mighty Power of God*" was penned by Isaac Watts in 1715 for his collection *Divine and Moral Songs for Children*, originally titled "Praise for Creation and Providence," after his father challenged him to write better church songs, leading to this joyful hymn praising God's creative power and presence in nature for children and adults alike.

The story behind the hymn "'Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus" is about author Louisa M. R. Stead finding profound faith after immense tragedy, specifically the drowning of her husband while rescuing a boy in New York. Left a widow with a young daughter, Stead's deep despair led her to write these words, finding strength in Jesus to trust Him completely, even when facing poverty and loss, becoming an anthem of hope that has comforted many through suffering.
