The handbell choir prelude selection "*Brethren We Have Met to Worship*" is a classic 19th-century American folk hymn, written by Methodist preacher George Atkins in 1819 during the Second Great Awakening. It was designed for camp meetings to encourage fervent prayer for the Holy Spirit's presence,, often paired with the tune "Holy Manna".

Their Offertory selection "*Great Is the Lord*" was written in 1982 by Michael W. Smith and his wife, Debbie Davis, in Nashville, Tennessee, inspired by a shared, prayerful study of Scripture. Debbie wrote the lyrics while Michael composed the music during evening songwriting sessions, focusing on themes of God's holiness, power, and faithfulness.

"Rejoice, Ye Pure in Heart" was written by Anglican theologian Edward Hayes Plumptre in May 1865 as a processional hymn for a choir festival at Peterborough Cathedral in England. Inspired by Psalm 20:5, it originally contained 11–12 stanzas to accompany the long procession of choirs, using the imagery of marching to represent the Christian journey.

"This Is My Father's World" originated as a 16-stanza poem by American Presbyterian pastor Maltbie D. Babcock, written around 1901 and inspired by his walks in Lockport, NY, where he'd say he was "going out to see my Father's world". Published posthumously in 1901, his friend Franklin L. Sheppard set three selected stanzas to music in 1915, using the tune "Terra Beata" (Blessed Earth) adapted from an old English folk melody, creating the beloved hymn we know today that celebrates God's presence in nature and His ultimate rule.

Written by Isaac Watts in 1714 (published 1719) as a metrical paraphrase of Psalm 90, "*Our God, Our Help in Ages Past*" was created to bring comfort during a time of national anxiety in England. The hymn was written as Queen Anne was dying and the country faced political uncertainty regarding the succession, promising that God remains an eternal, reliable refuge when human structures fail.

CALL TO CONFESSION:

The more we know God's holiness, the more we can sense our distance from our creator. The more we seek justice and faithful living, the more we understand our complicity in systems that oppress. With humble hearts, let us confess our brokenness, our selfishness and our sin.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (UNISON)

Gracious God, we confess that it is harder to do than we expected, this life of faith. You call us to be salt of the earth and to live lives of justice and righteousness and love. One day, perhaps, we will commit more fully, but the status quo works better for us right now. Forgive us, we pray. Startle our senses and disrupt our routines. Renew in us the passion for doing what is right in your eyes, and

inspire us to be sources of your light in the world. May we, like the prophets and the saints, act by faith no matter how high the cost.

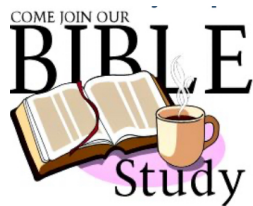
Announcements:
